In the meeting with the Commissioners Manger Brian Austin and Refuse Board Member Rod Karst stated that the Commissioners would pay for the telephone. Refuse Board discussed sending a letter to the commissioners reminding them about the financial strain this will be on the budget and the Refuse Board and Manager Austin heard the Commissioner's say they would pay for the cell phone.

Manager Brian Austin informed the Refuse Board the landfill has been open on Saturdays until 4:00 PM since August 1, 2020. Refuse Board informed Mr. Austin to keep it open on Saturdays until 4:00 PM through the month of August and then report how much business has gone across the scale.

Discussion was held on Kari Lee Knierim resigning from the Refuse Board. Mrs. Knierim was the representative from Nashua. Town of Nashua will need to be contacted and informed of her resignation. Refuse Board would like a letter sent to Mrs. Knierim thanking her for her dedication, work, and time on the Refuse Board.
